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ABSTRACT

Maternal–Fetal Medicine often involves caring for women and families facing uncertainty, complex diagnoses, and difficult clinical decisions. While clinical excellence remains essential, compassionate care is equally critical in supporting patients through high-risk pregnancies.

This workshop explores how empathy and evidence-based medicine can work together to improve patient outcomes and experiences. Through expert presentations and a multidisciplinary panel discussion, participants will examine communication strategies, counselling frameworks, and approaches to providing emotional support during complex obstetric care. The session will highlight practical ways clinicians can strengthen compassionate practice in Maternal–Fetal Medicine.
